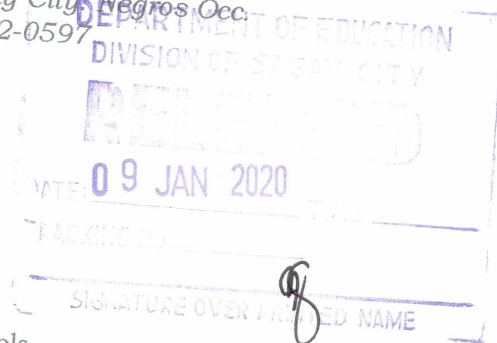

DIVISION YES-O CAMP 2020

1. The Schools Division of Sagay City through the School Governance and Operations Division (SGOD) will conduct the **Division Youth for Environment in Schools Organization (YES-O) Camp** at **Bulanon National High School** on **January 24-25, 2020** with the theme: **"YES-O: #HandaParaSaKalikasan"**.
2. The activity seeks to achieve the following objectives:
 - a. strengthen the implementation of the Youth for Environment in Schools (YES) Program pursuant to DepEd Order No. 52 s. 2011 (Strengthening Environmental Education in Public and Private Schools and DepEd Order No. 93 s-2011 (Mandated Programs, Projects and Activities to the Youth for Environment in School Programs);
 - b. develop awareness about the science of climate change and its effects in the country;
 - c. improve students' deeper consciousness on the state of the environment focusing on significant issues and concerns;
 - d. encourage students' active participation and determined concrete action in the protection, preservation and rehabilitation of the environment; and
 - e. instill environmental values in every student to motivate actual involvement in worthwhile programs, projects and activities for the environment.
3. Participants on the said activity will be **Division Federated YES-O Officers and Advisers/Coordinators, YES-O Officers and Advisers** both high school and elementary with **minimum of Two (2) and maximum of Five (5) per School (Elementary and High School)** The list of participants must be submitted on or before January 20, 2020 to the Division Office c/o SGOD PDO's using the attached template (Registration Form).
4. Each District should bring their Banner and prepare a brief YES-O yell to introduce their delegation.
5. Activities during the Camp includes, Plenary Sessions, Jingle for Environment and Interpretative Dance Contest, Laro ng Lahi, Film Showing, Mangrove Planting & Clean-Up Drive.
6. Participants who wanted to stay overnight in the venue may signify in the Pre-Registration Form.
7. Each District should create a **Headdress** to be worn during the Environmental Parade on the Opening Program. *The Headdress will be made of any Recycled Materials and should be aligned with the camps theme.*

8. A registration fee of *One Hundred Fifty Pesos (Php150.00)* per Non IUS Elementary, Secondary & Senior High School that will be charged against *School MOOE* to be deducted on the month of February to cover the expenses for the kits, certificates, materials for the contests, other expenses incurred by the participants will be charged against PTA Funds, IGP& School Canteen subject to the existing, accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
9. Participants are advised to bring their *Tent & beddings, Reusable Water Container, Utensils, Foods & Snacks during the whole activity*. Students/pupils participants should present a waiver duly signed by their parent or guardian and the YES-O Advisers should also have the approved Authority to Travel signed by the School Principal.
10. Meeting for all District Coordinators and Division Federated YES-O Advisers for elementary and secondary will be on *January 13, 2020, Monday @3:00 p.m.* venue to be announced.

Composition	Any grade level
Duration of the Performance	3-5 minutes
Rules and Guidelines	<p>1. Lyrics must be original written in Filipino and must be theme based. Adaptation of melody is allowed.</p> <p>2. Acapella is allowed or any musical instrument can be used as accompaniment.</p> <p>3. Instrumentalists are included as participants.</p> <p>4. No pyro techniques allowed.</p> <p>5. Choreography is allowed but limited only to hand movements (participants should be stationary).</p> <p>6. Performance is 3-5 minutes only. One point deduction will be made from the average score for every 30 seconds exceeded and 5 points deduction for any violation of the above mentioned rule.</p> <p>7. Participants should wear their Division YES-O t-shirt only.</p> <p>8. Lyrics in four (4) copies should be submitted during the registration.</p> <p>9. The judge's decision is final and irrevocable.</p>
